Fantastic Fall was the theme for October. The preschool class enjoyed the weather transition this month. We have been noting and graphing the change in the weather. The students completed sequence charts of falling leaves and the growth stages of a pumpkin. The class also learned to count in Swahili. We will continue to count in Spanish as well.
